PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES

Attendance Update

I am really pleased to see our attendance figures for the whole of term one are meeting our 2024 goal for attendance- see the chart below:

Attendance at school	Our Goal for 2024	Term One Attendance
Less than 70%	0%	0%
70% - 80%	6%	1%
80% - 90%	24%	24%
90%+	70%	75%

There was 17 emails sent out this week to those students who were not attending regularly (90%+), so you can be aware of how your child is tracking. If you do not receive an email that is because your child is regularly attending school. Thanks for you understanding and support as we aim to lift our attendance and consequently our student achievement at school. Because we have lifted our attendance, I will cut back the

attendance emails from every five weeks to 10 weeks, at the end of each term.

THE BIG RECONNECT **Parent Information Evening**

This term, Ōwhango School will start delivering a programme to all our students on internet safety called The Big Reconnect. Due to the content and serious nature of this information, we need an adult from each family to attend the information evening where an overview of the programme will be delivered, and how you can support it in your home.

The information evening is at school on Wednesday 8th May @7pm. This hui will be about 90 minutes long.

To enable your attendance, we will provide finger food to eat, and a movie will play in another room for any children who need to come along due to childcare needs- note that the content in this information evening is inappropriate for children to view.

In these information evenings you will learn about:

The Problems:

- Cyberbullying How bullies can reach our kids 24/7.
- Social media How social media is affecting the mental health in 3 out of 5 children. FOMO, depression, anxiety.
- Gaming and the developing brain An oversupply of dopamine leading to dopamine deficiency, synaptic pruning, and the underdevelopment of social skills and empathy.
- Naked Selfies The pressure to send nudes from intermediate up through high school.

- Online predators The methods they use, how to spot them.
- Online porn vs healthy sexuality How consuming online pornography as a child or teen can create a sexual template where violence, aggression, and dominance are seen as normal and consent can become very blurry.

The Solutions

- Filters Which filters are best and how to install them.
- Smartphones How to lock down a smartphone to make it a safe phone.
- Boundaries How to put good boundaries in place around device use.
- **3 golden rules** The 3 golden rules that will keep your kids safe.
- Talking to your kids How to have difficult conversations with your kids.
- Challenging our own phone and device usage - Reconnecting as a family.

Alongside the information above for parents, you also get access to the modules that will be taught at school to your children. Each topic is age appropriate- tailored to different age groups, so use the ones that apply to your children's ages. The whole series is available to you, to sit and watch with them, covering the following:

- Cyberbullying Why cyberbullies bully and how to keep yourself safe
- Naked Selfies The pressure to send nudes from intermediate up through high school and how to say no
- Social media How social media is affecting the mental health in 3 out of 5 children. FOMO, depression, anxiety
- Gaming and the developing brain An oversupply of dopamine leads to dopamine deficiency, synaptic pruning and the underdevelopment of social skills and empathy.
- Online predators The methods they use, how to spot them and how to get out from under their control if you have been trapped.
- Fake news, mis and disinformation

 How online algorithms can create a very small world view.
- Online porn vs healthy sexuality How consuming online porn can create a

sexual template where violence, aggression and dominance are seen as normal and consent can become very blurry.

• Healthy relationships - What they look like and how to remove yourself from an unhealthy one.

Ōwhango School has signed up for this programme that allows all our families to have access until the end of this year. This is usually \$99 per family but you are getting it free. Each family will need to log in with their own email address and use the Coupon Code below to get access.

Our Kids Online

Our Kids Online was created in 2018 by Rob & Zareen Cope after all four children in their blended family started asking for handheld devices. Having both authored books in the mental health space, the pair were concerned about reports of increases in anxiety and depression in tweens & teens, so undertook further research.

After discovering a plethora of harms being caused to children of all ages, throughout the world, they decided to continue working in this field helping parents & caregivers understand the fallouts, providing safety solutions, and educating on how to increase resilience in kids through their Cyber Safety Presentations in school information evenings.

In 2020, they released their first documentary 'Our Kids Online: Porn, Predators & How to Keep Them Safe'. Their second documentary 'Our Kids Online: Social Media, Gaming & the Developing Brain is currently in production.

Our Kids Online: Porn, Predators & How to Keep Them Safe' has been screened at several events including global summits, overseas film festivals and at the Beehive in New Zealand.

In August 2022 Rob & Zareen created an online programme for school students from Years 1 through 13, 'The Informed & Empowered Programme'.

This programme consists of modules and resources to help educate students on how to keep themselves safe in the online world in relation to various potential negative impacts such a predator exposures, cyberbullying, misinformation, excessive social media use and more. It also covers emotions, healthy relationships and setting healthy boundaries.
