## **PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGES**

## **2025 Staffing Numbers**

We have just received our staffing allocation for 2025 from the Ministry of Education. As expected, we will be returning to being a threeteacher school. One of the conditions of being a four-teacher school this year, was that we put in place an enrolment scheme to manage our roll size. As you know, we have done this. At present we are looking at starting with a roll of 67, growing to 71 by the end of the year.

## New Staffroom Update

There has been a lot of work going on behind the scenes getting the plans refined and approved for our new staffroom. This is now out for tender with builders. The ministry is managing and funding this project, using their short-term-rollgrowth funds, and are hoping that it is completed by the start of next year. It is being sited within our current footprint- where the cleaners' cupboard, corridor and junior toilets are located. The cleaner's cupboard will shift to the music storage room, the school is over-endowed with toilets which is why we are not needing the junior toilets in the future.

Next year, the old staffroom (Whaea Siobhan's room currently) will be converted to a multipurpose room, with a focus on teaching technology lessons in there. We are looking at

installing several ovens for cooking, removable benches for hard materials (think woodwork), art and craft equipment. This conversion is partly in response to the high school no longer providing technology lessons on their site; however, we would like to use this room for all our year levels, not just the year 7 and 8 students who are funded for extra technology lessons.

## Other Stuff

There have also been a few small jobs going on around the school.

In the Sick Bay, also know as the Shower Toilet as it has a shower in there, we have installed a window treatment to replace the old window frosting that was wrinkled and looking messy. For some strange reason when this room was built, they installed clear glass so that people could see in! This new window treatment has kowhai flowers and fantails printed onto it, making the room much more cheerful.



The kowhai and fantails on the window Over by the sandpit, we have planted a silk tree as this will grow into a beautiful shade tree over the sandpit. This is quite fast-growing tree, so we should get shade soonish, and being deciduous we will get plenty of light over the winter months. Here is a photo of what the tree will quickly grow into:
