This week has been super busy with the Wool in Schools container, our trip to Gray's Farm and Pet Day scattered with a few Term 4 assessments in between.



Inside the Wool in Schools container The Wool in Schools container has been heaps of fun, with hands-on learning experiences that allowed us to get to understand how wool is grown and used along with some of its great properties and purposes. The students enjoyed noticing the differences between greasy, scoured and combed wool and writing some adjectives to describe it such as fluffy, soft, dirty, poo-y, puffy, oily, greasy, squishy, swirly, wavy, earthy, and yucky.


With Mr Starkey we made some sheep art, felted some wool making balls and felted wool snakes. With Whaea Jessica, we used wool as a measuring tool.


